Adoption During COVID: Homes & Hearts Are Open



Year End

Hello supporters of Paws+Claws!

Thank you all for your continued support of Paws+Claws and the work we do here. This year has been an interesting year for all of us; the onset of COVID-19 bringing business closures, social distancing, and mask mandates. Even so, we have had more than 300 adoptions so far this year, and more than 950 since we opened in July of 2017. This would not have been possible without our donors for their gracious gifts, our boarding and grooming guests for entrusting us with their pets, the revenue of which supports our shelter pets, and our veterinarians, Dr. Steve Ekholm and Dr. Matt Eberts, for the amazing care they provide our pets. We have also received the generous support of area veterinarians Dr. Kyle Adkins, Dr. Alan Olander, Dr. Megan Hockenson, and Dr. Amanda Bergin. We also have to thank our staff for the work they do for these animals every day, our social media followers for sharing our posts, and our community for their ongoing support. In whatever way you help Paws+Claws, please know how much it is appreciated.

Now that we have reached the end of the year, we are able to truly appreciate all of the generosity, compassion, and devotion that this season brings. As you are looking for a place to contribute your gifts, we ask that you keep Paws+Claws in mind. Your gifts are essential for helping our pets to be happy and healthy in these troubling times and allowing us to find their forever homes.

Like so many other organizations, COVID-19 has completely changed the way we operate at Paws+Claws and how we interact with the community. In March we shut our doors to the public, pausing all boarding and adoption services. On May 4 we resumed adoption services and on May 18 we re-opened boarding, both operating in a curbside capacity only. During our shut-down and ever since, we have received an overwhelming amount of support from our volunteers and fosters. While we haven't had non-staff members in the building since March, our volunteers have still been helping us however they can, whether it is walking dogs, sewing masks, or offering to foster pets for us.

Once again, Paws+Claws had to pause adoption and boarding services. Adoption services have started up again, and boarding is planned to resume with the new year, but this further loss of revenue is a strain on our financial situation. Paws+Claws hopes to be here for many years to come to be able to help pets in need like Holly, a stray dog that came in to us this summer. Poor Holly was emaciated and injured when she came to us. She had a shoe string tied around her neck like a collar, her fur was matted with feces, and her wounds were infested with maggots. Our staff spent hours giving the sweet girl love and trying to get her cleaned up, but ultimately realized

her wounds were too great and the most humane option was to help her cross the

rainbow bridge.

We are grateful that we have the facility and the resources necessary to help pets like Holly, but we need your help to keep it all up and running. Your donations allowed us to provide the necessary care for Holly, as well as providing for the health and wellbeing of all other pets in our care. Separation Anxiety in Pets: 7 Tips and Tricks

Following is an article from the ASPCA with information on separation anxiety; article was found at https://www.aspca.org/news/separation-anxiety-pets-7-tips-and-tricks. The ASPCA is a great resource for many kinds of information.

One thing we know for certain about our furry counterparts is that dogs and cats are creatures of habit. They thrive on consistency, and sudden scheduling changes can throw them for a loop! As many of us have been getting used to more time at home during the COVID-19 pandemic, we can't help but wonder how our pets will react once we begin getting back into some of our routines.

Your dog or cat may be left wondering why everyone is rushing out the door instead of continuing to spend time at home. And separation anxiety can be very common in our furry counterparts. Luckily, we've got seven expert tips to help with the transition, and hopefully, avoid separation anxiety and negative habits from developing.

- 1. Try to keep your pet's daily routine as consistent as possible even while you are currently home by keeping walks and meals around the same time each day. Try to mimic what your pet's schedule will look like on a typical work or school day, each day.
- 2. A sudden decrease in time with the family can be difficult for pets, especially if they have become accustomed to having people with them all hours of the day. Make sure you give your pet 'practice' with shorter periods of alone time every day. For example, have them stay home while you go for a stroll or do some yard work, that way the transition is not abrupt and stressful. Gradually increase the duration you're away from home as much as possible to prepare for longer stretches of time.
- 3. Your pet may be used to midday play sessions or walks. Ramping down that exercise and interaction due to schedule changes could leave your pet with pent up energy. Scheduling times for play that fit your new schedule can help your pal adjust.
- 4. Rotate your dog or cat's toys to help to keep them novel and provide enrichment for your pets. Interactive toys or healthy chews can help keep your dog or cat active and engaged while you are gone. For dogs, toys stuffed with their favorite food and then frozen can provide entertainment and satisfy any foraging needs. There are many safe and tasty chew items available for dogs, so many that you can offer a different one every day of the week! Free games apps and battery-operated toys, available online, can entertain cats for hours of play on their own.
- 5. Leave on soothing music or TV for auditory or visual stimulation that can help keep your pet engaged when you're not at home. Cats, in particular, really enjoy watching TV shows that feature animals.
- 6. While the family is away for longer periods of time during the day, you will want to have your pets feeling safe and secure at home. Be sure to look out for signs of anxiety such as nervous pacing and panting, vocalizing or trying to leave with you as you prepare to depart. While you're gone, anxious pets may soil in the house or engage in destructive behavior, particularly of items that smell strongly of you.
- 7. To address your pet's stress, you can also consider contacting a certified applied animal behaviorist, veterinary behaviorist or certified professional dog trainer, many of whom are offering services virtually during this time.

Pet Health and Safety Reminders Winter 2020-2021

Many of the same cold weather guidelines we follow also apply to our pets; please review the following guidelines* from the ASPCA (https://www.aspca.org/pet-care/general-pet-care/cold-weather-safety-tips).

- It is best to continue using flea & tick and heartworm preventatives year round. You won't be out of the routine once spring comes and this way your pets will always be covered.
- Do not leave pets outside in cold weather. Along with standard cold-weather dangers, peets can become disoriented in freezing temperatures. If it's too cold for you, it's too cold for your pet.*
- Consider feeding pets a litte extra food in the winter to make up for the energy they are burning to keep themselves warm.*
- Watch for antifreeze leaks and other harmful toxins.*
- Keep your home humidifed and towel dry your pets when they come inside to prevent flaky skin.*


Thank you to those who ensure our longevity
